

GETTING STARTED *“In your opinion...”*

1. This week’s message focused on how Jesus, in His humanity, is also superior to the Angels. Can you remember anything from the sermon that was helpful, eye-opening, or troubling? Explain.
2. How important is it to our personal Christian faith to believe that Jesus will return and rule the earth? What are the implications to our faith and lifestyle if we did not believe it?
3. How important is it for a Christian to faithfully prepare for His return? What are some things we could do to accomplish that?
4. How susceptible/vulnerable are we humans to conceit when it comes to holding positions of power and authority? Why does this happen?

GOING DEEPER *“According to the Bible...”*

Answer the following questions from what the Bible says in the suggested reading.

- **Read 1 Corinthians 15:29-32** How does Paul say we should live if there is no resurrection of Christ and believers (and subsequently no return of Christ)? Why?
- **Read 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18.** On what historical fact does Paul base the future fact of Jesus’ return and believers’ resurrection? (vs. 14) Is this enough of a basis? Explain.
- **Read Luke 19:11-27**
 - Who does the master and servants represent?
 - What does the master command the servants to do while he is gone? (vs. 13)
 - What might a “mina” represent?
 - What kind of reward is granted by the master? How does this compare with ruling with Jesus?

- What difference can this make as we anticipate the return of Christ and reigning with Him?
