<p>First Trumpet Rev. 8:7 Hail and fire mixed with blood hurled down upon the earth. It burned one third of the earth, trees, and grass.</p>			<p>First Bowl Rev. 16:2 Poured on the land. Sores broke out on people with the mark of the Beast.</p>
<p>Second Trumpet Rev. 8:8, 9 Blazing mountain thrown into the sea turning one third of it to blood, killing one-third of sea life, destroying one-third of ships.</p>			<p>Second Bowl Rev.16:3 Poured out on the sea and turns it to dead man's blood. Every living thing in the sea dies.</p>
<p>Third Trumpet Rev. 8:10, 11 Torch-like star falls in rivers and streams and "Wormwood" poisons one third of rivers, many people die.</p>			<p>Third Bowl Rev. 16:4-7 Poured out on the rivers and streams which become blood.</p>
<p>Fourth Trumpet Rev. 8:12, 13 One-third of sun, moon, and stars struck, one-third of day and night turned dark.</p>			<p>Fourth Bowl Rev. 16:8, 9 Poured out on the sun. Sun scorches people who curse God and still refuse to repent.</p>
<p>Fifth Trumpet Rev. 9:1-12 A star falls from the sky and given the key to the Abyss. Smoke rises and darkens the sun. For five months locust-like scorpions torture those without God's seal.</p>			<p>Fifth Bowl Rev. 16:10, 11 Poured out on the throne of the Beast whose kingdom is plunged into darkness. Men gnawed their tongues and cursed God because of their pains and sores refusing to repent.</p>
<p>Sixth Trumpet Rev. 9:13-21 Four angels released who were bound at the Euphrates. A third of mankind is killed by an army of 200 million.</p>			<p>Sixth Bowl Rev. 16:12-14 Poured on the Euphrates and it dries up to make way for the kings coming to battle.</p>
<p>"The mystery of God is accomplished" Rev. 10:7</p>			<p>"Behold I come like a thief." Rev. 16:15</p>
<p>Seventh Trumpet Rev. 11:15-19 Loud voices in heaven say, "The kingdom of our world has become the kingdom of our Lord...and He will reign for ever and ever." "Your wrath has come." It's time to judge the dead and reward the saints. "And there came flashes of lightning, rumblings, peals of thunder, an earthquake and a great hailstorm."</p>			<p>Seventh Bowl Rev. 16:17-21 Poured into the air and out of the temple came a loud voice saying, "It is done!" "Then there came flashes of lightning, rumblings, peals of thunder and a severe earthquake" that destroys "Babylon" who receives "the wine of the fury of his wrath." From the sky 100 lb. hailstones fall upon men who continued to curse God.</p>
